Resolution Establishing a Standing Committee on Technology

WHEREAS, information technology is being widely employed to improve tax administration within states, and

WHEREAS, the Multistate Tax Commission recognizes the untapped potential of technology to improve multistate tax administration and has initiated significant efforts to tap that potential; and

WHEREAS, such efforts require technological and administrative coordination and linkages between the Commission and its participating states; and

WHEREAS, such efforts would benefit greatly from the expertise within the states; and

WHEREAS, the Multistate Tax Commission's Audit Committee has, in recent years, convened a subcommittee on technology issues that has considered certain technological issues related to auditing; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Multistate Tax Commission hereby establishes a Standing Committee on Technology in Multistate Tax Administration to be charged with advising the Commission on plans to use information technology to advance the purposes of the Multistate Tax Compact, including but not limited to the development of joint systems that link together the Commission and its Member States; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Chair, Vice-Chair and Executive Director develop specific goals and objectives to guide the initial formation and work of this committee; and be it further

RESOLVED, that this committee be comprised of members drawn from both the existing Audit Subcommittee on Technology and other representatives with expertise in information technology as may be designated by individual states; and be it further

RESOLVED, that this committee meet twice a year to conduct its work, with such meetings to be coordinated with the meetings of standing committees of the Multistate Tax Commission.
