Resolution 99-15
IRS Reorganization

WHEREAS, the Internal Revenue Service is engaged in an ongoing reorganization project, the goal of which is to provide America's taxpayers top quality service by helping them understand and meet their tax responsibilities and by applying the tax law with integrity and fairness to all, and

WHEREAS, the IRS has actively sought, through the Multistate Tax Commission and the Federation of Tax Administrators, the participation of state and local tax administrators in order to design a tax administration system that will expeditiously achieve the aforesaid goal, and

WHEREAS, the states are actively involved in their own projects to streamline and modernize their state and local tax systems so as to achieve the identical goal, and

WHEREAS, the IRS and the states can mutually benefit from their experiences in their respective reorganization projects, and

WHEREAS, the reorganization of the federal tax system requires adequate financial resources in order to achieve the aforesaid goal, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Multistate Tax Commission commends the IRS for its ongoing work in reorganizing the administration of the federal tax system, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Multistate Tax Commission further commends the IRS for actively seeking participation by state and local tax administrators and the general public during the reorganization project, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Multistate Tax Commission urges the federal government to further utilize the accumulated expertise of present and former state and local tax administrators by appointing them to IRS advisory commissions and boards, and be it finally

RESOLVED, that the Multistate Tax Commission urges the Congress to fully fund the IRS reorganization project.
