- Improve job skills
- Learn new techniques and tools
- Promote to higher job classification
- Perform the job quicker and more efficiently
- Provide a better work product

- On-the-job training.

# Formal Classroom Training

## Pros

- Focused
- Specialized
- Complete

# Formal Classroom Training

## Cons

- Expensive
- Time Commitment
- Approvals

# Comparisons

## PDI Course

- COBOL based
- 10-15 weeks
- All on-site

## Mt. SAC Course

- SQL based
- 12 weeks maximum
- 7 weeks on-site

# Specialized Courses

- ACL or IDEA training
- Microsoft Access and Excel
- Statistical Sampling
- QuickBooks

Useful for initial training to get new staff started

Expensive

May not be focused on CAS duties

- Statistical sampling

Limited availability for Computer Audit  
Specialists

General topics

No hands-on training

# Conferences

- FTA/MTC Audit & Computer Technology Workshop
- FTA/MTC Statistical Sampling Workshop

Limited availability

Provides basic information

Limited or no hands-on training

# Web Training

- ACL on-line training
- IDEA on-line training
- Windows Access and Excel on-line training

Good initial training resource.

Not specialized for CAS.

Limited topics

# On-the-Job Training

- Focused
- Specialized

Good for new CAS staff.

Good trainer is essential.

Limited learning.
