Uniformity Proposal Before the Commission: Recommended Amendments to the Commission's Model General Allocation and Apportionment Regulation

Helen Hecht, MTC General Counsel, briefly addressed the <u>Resolution Adopting Amendments</u> to the Multistate Tax Commission's Model General Allocation and Apportionment Regulations. She addressed the project's timeline and the edits that had been necessary to make the regulations reflect changes the Commission had made to the provisions of UDITPA contained in Compact, Article IV.

Phil Horwitz, on behalf of Colorado, moved for adoption of the Resolution Adopting Amendments to the Multistate Tax Commission's Model General Allocation and Apportionment Regulations. The motion passed by roll call vote, with 11 states for, totaling 89.06% in favor. No state opposed the motion and 5 states were absent. The Commissioners voted as follows:
