

National Nexus Program (NNP) Director's Report for 3rd Quarter, FY 2020 April 21, 2020 San Antonio, TX

Multistate Voluntary Disclosure Program (MVDP)

The Nexus Program 3rd Quarter, FY 2020 results (July 1, 2019, through March 31, 2020) are provided below.

• Nexus states' collections: \$15,290,411	(\$14,695,429 FY 2019)
• Non-Nexus states' collections: \$0	(\$48,892 FY 2019)
• Nexus states' executed agreements: 429	(379 FY 2019)
• Nexus states' average contract value: \$35,642	2 (FY 2019: \$38,774)

The above amounts include checks received by the Commission or amounts paid by the taxpayer directly to the states and reported to the Commission. Interest on back tax paid and the value of a new taxpayer are not included. The Commission received applications from 208 taxpayers in calendar year 2019, and so far this year, 77 taxpayers have applied. Most of the applications are based on economic nexus.

Membership

There are currently thirty-eight participating states (including the District of Columbia) in the NNP, with Rhode Island having most recently joined effective October 1, 2017. Commission staff continues to reach out to non-member states.
