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National Nexus Program (NNP) Director's Report for FY 2019 August 5, 2019 Boise, Idaho

Multistate Voluntary Disclosure Program (MVDP)

The FY 2019 NNP results (July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019) are provided below.

• Nexus states' collections: \$14,695,429 (\$18,601,151 in FY 2018)

• Non-Nexus states' collections: \$ 48,892 (\$0 in FY 2018)

• Nexus states' executed agreements: 379 (3,087 in FY 2018)

• Nexus states' average contract value: \$38,774 (FY 2018: \$6,026)

The above amounts include checks received by the Commission or amounts paid by the taxpayer directly to the states and reported to the Commission. Interest on back tax paid and the value of a new taxpayer are not included.

<u>Membership</u>

There are currently thirty-eight participating states (including the District of Columbia) in the NNP, with Rhode Island having most recently joined effective October 1, 2017. Delaware ended their participation in the Nexus Program as of the end of FY 2018. Commission staff continues to reach out to non-member states.
