1. If you are signed in online through Zoom for Government, we will have a record of your participation.
2. As you join, you will already be muted. Please stay muted so we don't get background noise, and if you wish to speak, make sure to unmute. If we need to, we will also mute people.

4. For those who have dialed in rather than logged in, you can find the documents for the meeting on the MTC digital products uniformity project page. For those who are logged in, we'll put documents on the screen as we discuss them.
5. The MTC uniformity committee asked this work group to draft a white paper on the sales taxation of digital products. We have scheduled work group meetings on the first Thursday of each month at 11 a.m. EDT unless otherwise noticed.

Our discussions are not formal, and it may be that we need to revisit an issue.

If you are a state participant, we understand that you are not speaking officially for your state unless you say otherwise; instead, you are providing input based on your experience and background with your state laws and other authorities and guidance to help the work group understand the issues presented and how best to proceed.
